3.	Instruction – Jesus again helps them how all of the Bible is pointing to Him as the Messiah!

- 1. Confusion They basically thought Jesus was a ghost!
- 2. Rebuke Jesus invites them to "Touch me, and see." Then He eats a piece of fish. GHOSTS DON'T EAT FISH!
- 3. Instruction Jesus again helps them <u>understand</u> how all of the Bible is pointing to Him as the Messiah!
