WEEK OF APRIL 19

NOW IT ALL MAKES SENSE! – LUKE 24:13-35

Parents,

This week's family guide is a little shorter and more pointed. The text has one major goal: to let Jesus change the way we read the Bible. There are only three days worth of discussion this week to help zero in on this one topic. And in order to help drive that point home, we wanted to highlight a few resources you use with your kids. We've already told you about some of these, but they all are worth mentioning again.

*The Jesus Storybook Bible by Sally Lloyd-Jones
The Biggest Story by Kevin DeYoung
The Garden, the Curtain, and the Cross by Carl Laferton*

DAY 1

Read Luke 24:13-27

Reflect

After His resurrection, Jesus walks with two of His disciples to Emmaus but they are kept from recognizing Him. On their journey, Jesus hears their doubts and fears about why they're disappointed Jesus didn't bring a kingdom like they expected. Jesus uses this as an opportunity to correct how they've misread the Bible. Their expectations have blinded them from seeing Jesus as the center of the story.

- *Have you ever watched a movie or read a book with a surprise ending? Did it change the way you thought about it or saw it the next time? Did you see clues for the surprise?*
- *Now think about Jesus' conversation with these two disciples. What kind of "clues" would they see in other Old Testament stories about Jesus dying and rising from the dead?*

Respond

Ask God to help you see how the resurrection changes everything. Ask Him to show you how Jesus is the central character in the whole Bible.

DAY 2

Read Luke 24:28-35

Reflect

At the end of their journey, Jesus shares a meal with these disciples. Something happens in those moments and the eyes of the men are opened to realize they've been with Jesus the whole time. Once they've seen Him, they declare it all makes sense. "Did not our hearts burn within us?" For those of us who've been with Jesus, we can say the same as these disciples. An encounter with Him leaves a lasting impression that we feel deep in our hearts.

- *Has someone ever told you a story that completely gripped you? A story you didn't want to end?*
- *Seeing Jesus in the Bible is like this; it grips us and holds our attention until it changes us. Can you think of stories in the Bible that have gripped your attention?*
- *What is a story that has helped you see and understand Jesus more?*

Respond

Pray and ask God to help you see the importance of Jesus' resurrection. Praise Him for the new life that He offers us because of Jesus.

DAY 3

Read John 5:39-40

Reflect

The purpose of Bible-reading is not just to read a book... It's to see Jesus. He tells us that to read the Bible and not see Him is to completely miss the point of reading it. Every time we open the Bible we ought to ask the question, "Where is Jesus here?"

Respond
